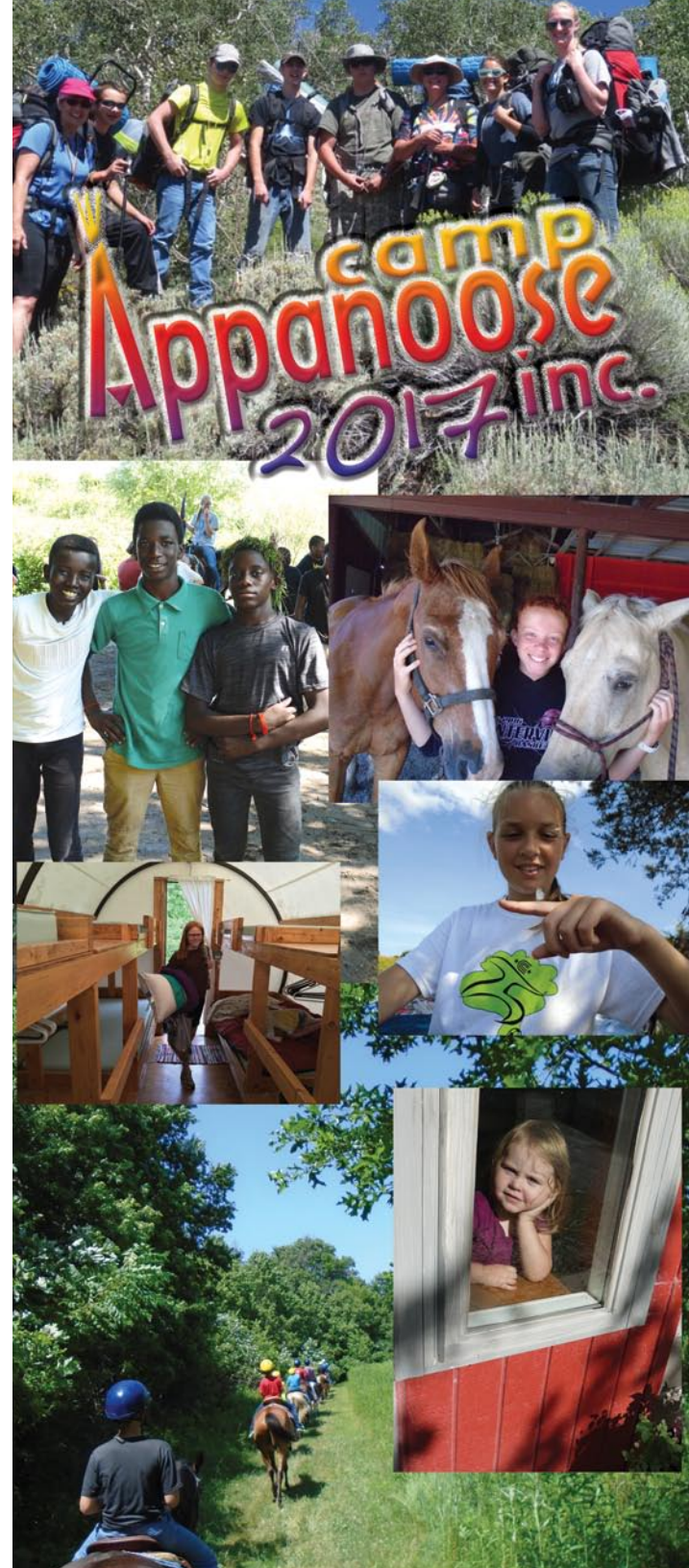

Classic Camps For Guys & Girls

(Camps for guys and girls entering the second through sixth grades)

Cowboy Camp - June 18-21

For those entering grades 2 and 3.

Three days of classic camp activities, such as hayrack rides, fishing, crafts, horses, games, Bible stories, really fun songs, nature lessons, paddle boats, swimming and many activities designed to introduce campers to a world of camp experiences.

Buckskinner Camps - I - June 18-24, II - June 25-July 1

For those entering grades 4-6.

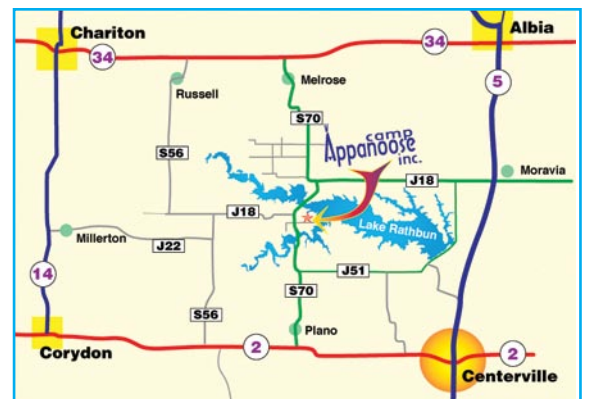
