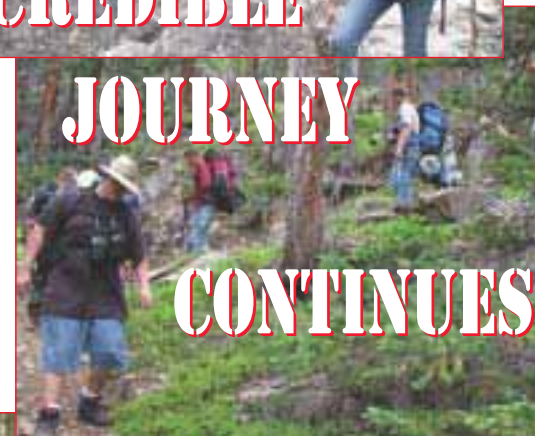

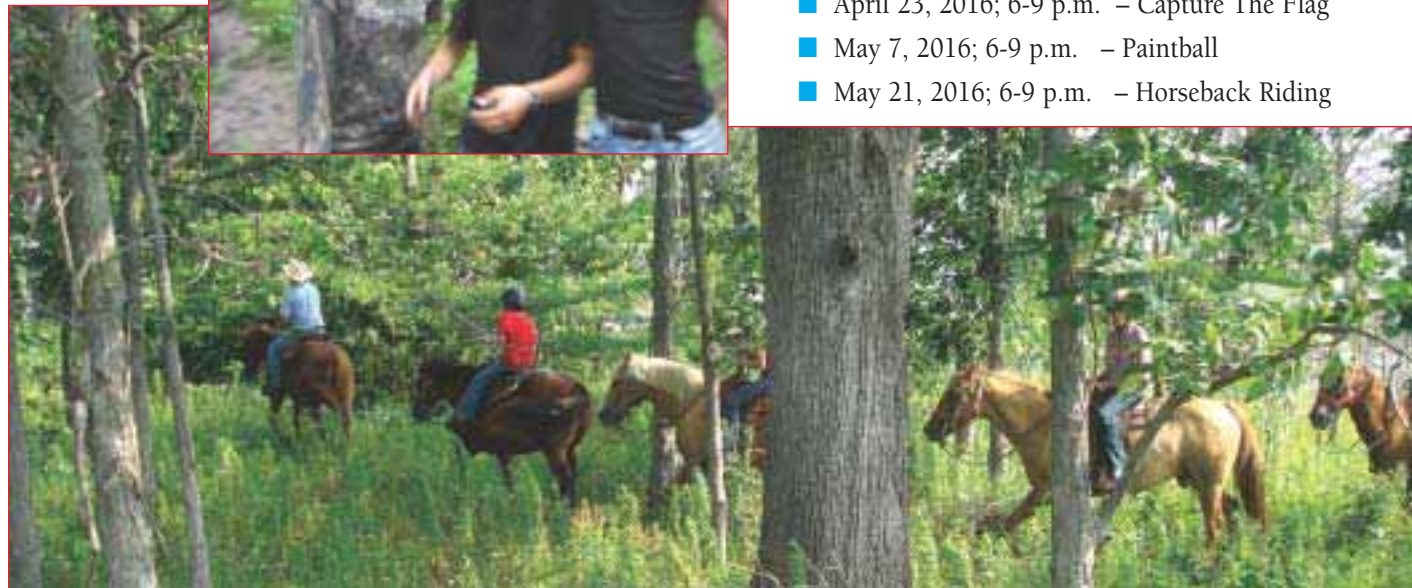
## Leadership Training Camp (LTC) – June 12-18
