## Teen Week II

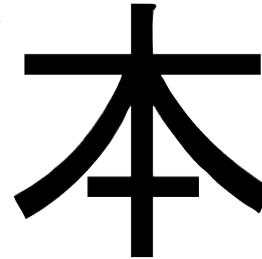
### Extreme Sports Camp – July 22-28

## Sugar Creek Horse Camps

### ▲ Rocky High On Horseback – July 30 - August 8

Grades 7 – 12 will ride trails through some of America's most spectacular scenery, even above tree line. You may sight elk, moose, Big Horn sheep or any number of other wildlife. Modest pre-trip equestrian skills are desirable. Guides and extra pack animals are provided, along with camp staff.

### ▲ Metro Bike Camp – June 24 -30

Grades 7 – 12 will explore some of the hundreds of miles of scenic bike trails in central Iowa. Each day features a different ride, all on trails, with great camp food, campfire Bible talks, and tent camping. Finish up with a night ride across the spectacular High Trestle Bridge, with its colorful lighting and great views. Bring your own bike or rent one for a modest fee.
