JOURNEY BY THE NUMBERS

Born to a sixteen year old father, who assumed the throne of his father's kingdom at the young age of twenty-two, Josiah's upbringing was anything but enviable. His father was an arrogant tyrant who followed the ritualistic cruelties of the current paganism. SO much hated by his own servants, Amon was finally murdered by those very servants in his home. Their conspiracy against the young king did not go unnoticed. Citizens in the kingdom immediately rose up and put the conspirators to death and then made his eight year old son king in Amon's place. How much of the trauma Josiah was eyewitness to, we may never know. However, we do know that while in his mid-teens, Josiah's course became a trajectory for change in his nation as he personally attended to monumental reforms and godly change. Il Chronicles 34 gives a skeletal biography of this dynamic young man as he began to seek the Lord at age sixteen. By age twenty he had identified the idolatry in his nation and eradicated it. At age twenty-six the Scriptures were retrieved from the temple building and as Josiah heard them read, it revolutionized his life. For the remainder of his relatively short life it was Josiah's passion to restore the worship of God to its rightful place.

As we look at the developments of Josiah's life at age eight, sixteen, twenty, twenty-six and then his death at age thirty-nine, it is a great reminder that the journey of life passes quickly and contains mile-markers which can be most significant
