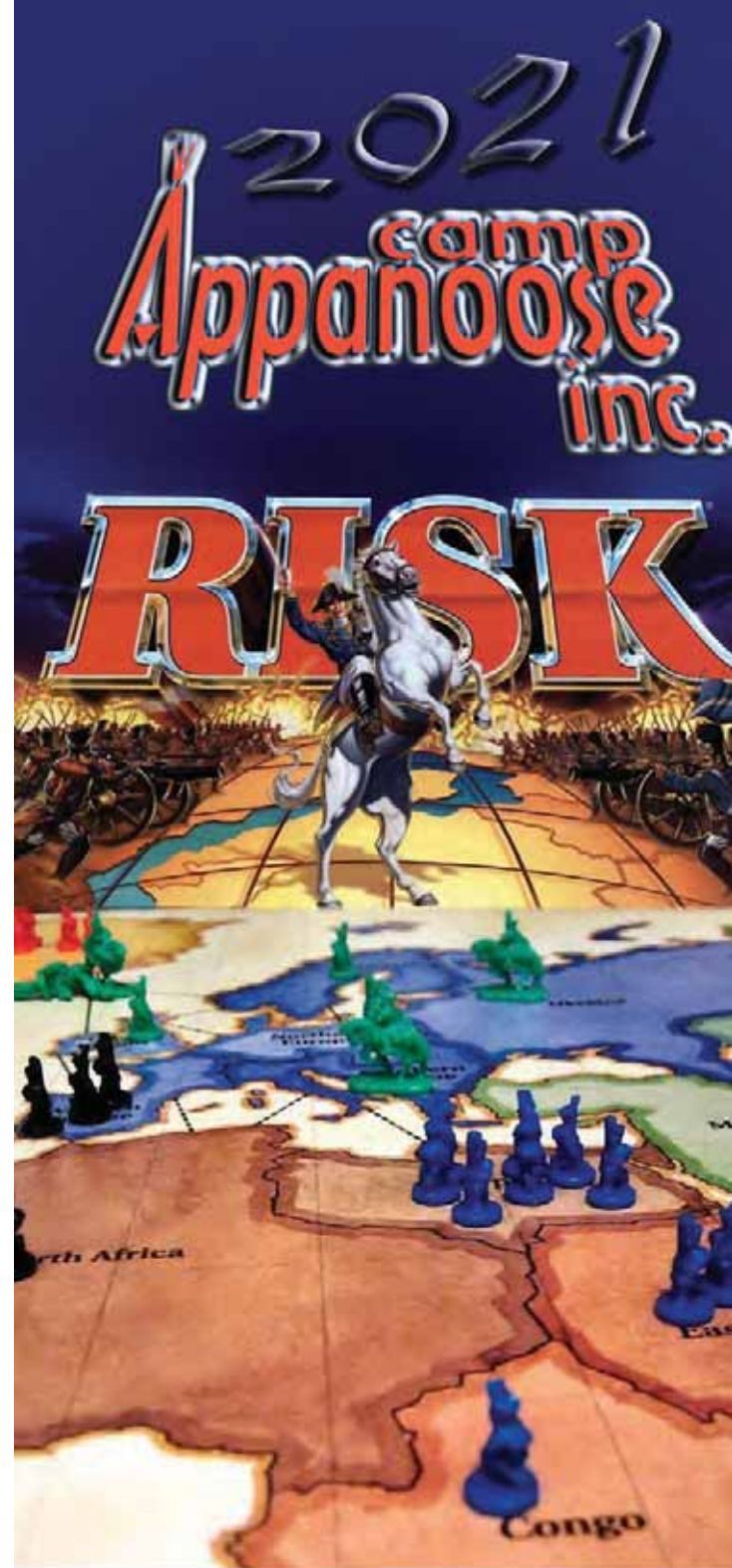

## Camps for Teens • Grades 7-12

### Leadership Training Camps

For mature teens and young adults.

#### LTC I – TRGR – June 13 - 19

Trained and Grounded (TRGR) features a week of in depth Bible education designed to enable the mature teen or young adult to think critically about significant issues confronting our world.

While each session stands on its own merit, attendance at TRGR for three consecutive years will provide participants with a rich overview of truth, forming a foundation for young adults who wish to make a difference in their world. Days are complete with great meals, recreational opportunities, and new friends.



#### LTC II – Camp Craft – June 6 - 12

Camp Craft, or staff training week, is also a practical leadership camp covering such areas as small group dynamics, spiritual formation, Biblical pedagogy, and recreational leadership. LTC II is offered without charge for those who apply and are available to work the entire summer. Younger participants will work as needed and will return home on the weekends.

#### Appanoose Builders Camp (ABC)

##### Preparing To Launch

ABC camp is a unique multi-week opportunity for a small group (4-6) of 14-17 year old boys. Each week will offer opportunities to experience specific building trades, while re-habbing an old house. Weeks will begin at

8:00 AM on Monday and end at 7:00 PM on Friday, June 27th – July 30th. For those successfully completing all five weeks, the Rocky High Adventure Camps will be awarded for an additional 200.00 (a 75-80% discount). Cost for all five weeks -1750.00 (by the week – 400.00 per week).

### Extreme Sports Camp – July 22-31

A re-designed camp for middle and older teens, Extreme Sports offers a few more days, allowing for several new opportunities during an expedition phase. Bible Talks and exploration will engage teens in the Scriptures while addressing foundational issues of faith and life. Classic camps' activities will include archery, riflery, paintballing, barrel racing, swimming, four wheeling, canoeing, water skiing, and more. During the expedition phase participants may choose between several options. Each of the off grounds options will feature two nights of outpost camping.

#### Expedition phase options – Four Treks

- ▲ **Water Trek** – Explore a section of a scenic water trail from a canoe or kayak. A water navigation lesson will be offered on Monday.
- ▲ **Horse Trek** – Choose this trek on horseback for a couple of days of trail riding. Experience the beauty of back country trails along with the companionship of a camp horse. Horse campers have first option.
- ▲ **Bike Trek** – Bring your bike along and experience some of the highlights of the hundreds of miles of Central Iowa's bike trails. (A limited number of loaner bikes available.)
